Introduction

This brief manual focuses on how to adapt to the differences between eOSCE and Valuatic, and if you already have started to prepare an exam in eOSCE, how you can import it in Valuatic.

Glossary

- *Forms* are the *checklists* to fill out.
- *Examiners* are the people filling out the forms.
- *Candidates* are the people or products being assessed.
- *Exam* is a package of evaluation data to be used in Valuatic Touch.

The desktop application to prepare forms and exams right on your PC.

Valuatic Studio also allows to observe the progress of an exam and to export results after an exam has finished.




Exam Migration

If you started to prepare an exam in eOSCE and wish to pass to Valuatic to take advantage of all the new features, this can be done effortlessly. Valuatic is indeed able to import eOSCE checklists.

Checklists Import

1. In eOSCE Editor, select the checklists you want to import in Valuatic and drag-and-drop it to the desired location while holding down the *shift* key.
2. In Valuatic Studio, Click on the *Extended action dropdown (...)*, then on *Import EOSCE Checklists...* and choose the file(s) you exported earlier.



Candidate and Examiner Import

Schedule Import


As Valuatic does not contain any constraining schedule, there is no need for an import!

≡ What happened to the OSCE Schedule?

This is where Valuatic diverges from eOSCE. As we learned from our customers, schedules are created manually in a spreadsheet and then had to be set up tediously in eOSCE. Even the result may have been comfortable for examiners, it is an additional and error prone work with limited value for the other users.

Now in Valuatic, the examiner can either choose a candidate manually or, to avoid mistakes, scan a Valuatic QR code provided to each student. It is even possible to scan the barcode of a student card if it does contain the student ID.

Last minute unexpected events can be handled trouble-free, even on the day of the exam!
